

The underprivileged African women with whom Rafiki partners are talented at making handcrafts, using skills passed down for generations and taught to them by others.

The Rafiki Exchange supports and serves these women by providing them with a market for their artisan products. Rafiki buys their products and brings them back to the United States to sell at their retail locations.
